The June 8th, 2021 Town of Tioga board meeting was brought to order at 7:00pm. Present were Councilman Robert Strong, Councilman Gerald Hyatt, Councilman Drew Griffin, and Councilman Robert Klossner by phone with Supervisor Lewis Zorn presiding.

Also, present were highway superintendent Russell Story, town attorney Adam Schumacher, John & Martha Walker, Diane Rogers and Joann Mosher.

Update from Superintendent Story:

- All the paving has been completed and chip seal will be done next week on the roads.
- Bridge NY accepted our grant application for Diamond Valley Rd bridge. We will not hear if the town has been awarded the grant till fall 2021 or Winter 2022.
- Did some shoulder and patch work on the roads.
- Located another army truck at a municipality in Campbell, NY. We are able to have the transfer case for free we just have to pull it ourselves.

Councilman Strong made the motion to accept the reports as given, Councilman Griffin seconded, carried.

Mr. & Mrs. Walker and their daughter, Diane Rogers, attended the meeting with questions and concerns over Lopke's running their trucks on Ayres Rd from their pit.

Supervisor Zorn stated that he had spoken with Steve Craig from Lopke's and that Lopke's were in the process of working an easement with the railroad to run the trucks parallel to the railroad tracks if sufficient "right of way" was available to them.

Supervisor Zorn stated that Steve Craig was also scheduled to meet at 3:00pm today with Ayres Rd residents to answer their questions and concerns.

The Walkers also expressed concern for the trucks pulling out onto Ayres Rd from Lopke's scales without stopping.

Supervisor Zorn stated he will speak to Steve Craig about this matter.

The Walkers requested some trees be removed or trimmed from the property bordering the intersection of Ayres Rd and Lopke's scales to improve visibility for the traffic.

This property is owned by Councilman Strong and he stated he will look into removing and/or trimming some trees if permitted due to possibly being a wetland.

The Board encouraged The Walkers to reach out to DEC with any questions they have with permit ID # 7-4936-00076/00001 issued to Lopke's from 04/02/2018 - 04/01/2023.

Supervisor Zorn stated that he, along with Steve Craig from Lopke's, would be happy to work with the Ayres Rd residents with any questions and concerns they have within the best of their abilities.

Councilman Hyatt requested Superintendent Story take current pictures of the condition of Ayres Rd for documentation purposes.

Joann Mosher requested that a sign be placed near her address on 52 Ayres Rd to make traffic aware of her autistic grandson.

Superintendent Story will order two "autistic children" signs have them installed in both directions of her residence.

Councilman Hyatt made the motion to have tire cleanup day August 6th & 7th from 8:00am to 12:00pm both days with a 19" tire size limit, eight tires per resident and up to eight additional tires for \$1.00 per tire fee, with proof of residency required, seconded by Councilman Griffin, carried.
